Canonicity – the church's recognition of the divine origin and authority of the sixty-six books of scripture. The church did not determine which books were canonical, but only recognized those books which were

Scripture is self-authenticating.

canonical.

1. Apostolicity (was it written by an apostle or authenticated by an apostle?)

It was the distinct calling of the apostles which gave them the authority to validate the prophets and write in such away under the inspiration of God to complete the prophetic words concerning the Messiah, Son of God, bringing both testaments together to complete the story of God.

2. Universality (was it widely read and accepted?)

The early church verified the validity of the New Testament through various tests. One such test was apostolicity: Did an apostle authenticate the writing in question? Did the disciples and the early church universally accept and read the writing in question?

Did the writing in question hold up to the doctrinal test in agreement with the writings of the other apostles? Therefore, it was the apostles themselves who canonized the Scriptures as we have them today. The 27 books of the NT seen today are the same as that of the 39th Easter Letter of Athanasius dated AD 367 and accepted by the Council of Carthage in AD

397.

3. Character (sufficiently spiritual, directed at godliness, doctrinal content in agreement with other apostles) recognized which books were "from the Lord" and which were not, though the process was by no means finalized by the end of the first century.

4. In AD 367, in the 39th Easter Letter of Athanasius, we find a list of the 27 books of the NT we have today.

This list was accepted by the churches east of the Mediterranean while churches in the west came to accept the same list some 30 years later, in AD 397, at the Council of Carthage.

Diocletian persecution (AD 303-11), in which Christians were tortured, their property taken, and their sacred books destroyed by fire, undoubtedly helped to move the church along in its recognition of which books were sacred (i.e., inspired) and which were not.

Inspiration

"Inspiration" is the theological word, derived from the Greek term $\theta \epsilon \acute{o} \pi \nu \epsilon \upsilon \sigma \tau \sigma \varsigma$, used to refer to the process whereby God superintended the human authors of scripture so that what they wrote was simultaneously their own words as well the Word of God himself; God "breathed out" his words through the words (using the minds and personalities) of his spokespeople.

Inspiration

Thus, through Spirit-inspired writings God has preserved an historical/theological record of his words and deeds and has given it to his covenant people as a means of grace that they might trust him fully and obey him implicitly. As a result of our sinfulness and finiteness we stand in need of such divine guidance and wisdom; scripture was inspired to that end.

Inerrancy

Inerrancy is a logical corollary to inspiration. The authors of Scripture was under the supernatural influence and guidance of the Holy Spirit. Since God is true, what they wrote and affirmed is in all ways true as well. Thus inerrancy applies to the autographa and Greek, Hebrew, and Aramaic copies insofar as they faithfully reproduce the autographa.

Inerrancy

The doctrine rightly teaches that the scriptures are without error in all that they affirm, whether they refer to geographical, historical, or theological issues. Thus, the scriptures are the final authority in matters of faith and practice and take precedence over tradition, culture, and creed. This doctrine also allows for different literary styles, poor grammar, approximations in numbers, etc.

"The Divine nature intended to teach not only those who were learned in the literature of Greece, but also the rest of mankind. Jesus adapted Himself in order to be understood by the simple multitudes whom He addressed. He sought to win their attention by using language familiar to them. In the New Testament it became know as:

Today it is known as: "The word of God." <u>Scripture</u>

The Bible is not a book, but rather a compilation of 66 books.



Greek word biblos (βίβλος), meaning "book," "scroll" or "parchment."



Ten Good Reasons for Reliability of the NT:

- 1. The manuscripts were copied accurately.
- 2. There were nine different authors of 27 books.
- 3. Their works were based on eyewitness testimony.
- 4. Early accepted Pauline Letters confirm its message.
- 5. There was no time for myth to replace basic facts.
- 6. The internal nature of the records is authentic.
- 7. Noted Roman historians have confirmed it.
- 8. Noted legal experts have vouched for it.
- 9. Numerous archaeological finds supported it.
- 10. Non-Christian sources support their message. Nothing like this exists for any other book from the ancient world!
