

Indeed, besides all this, it is the third day since these things happened. 22. “But also some women among us amazed us. When they were at the tomb early in the morning, 23. and did not find His body, they came, saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said that He was alive.

Luke 24:24-27

24. “Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just exactly as the women also had said; but Him they did not see.” 25. And He said to them, “O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! 26 “Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?” 27 Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.

44. Now He said to them, “These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled.” 45. Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, 46 and He said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Christ would suffer and rise again from the dead the third day...

The Things Written about Jesus in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms

Genesis 3:15 God gave a promise to send Messiah

And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed; He shall bruise you on the head, and you shall bruise him on the heel.”

Messiah would be born of a woman.

But when he had considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for the Child who has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. (Matt. 1:20)

But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law. (Gal. 4:4)

Messiah would come from the line of Abraham

“In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice.” (Gen. 22:18)

The record of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham. (Matt. 1:1)



Messiah would be a descendant of Isaac

But God said, “No, but Sarah your wife will bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac; and I will establish My covenant with him for an everlasting covenant for his descendants after him. (Gen. 21:4)

...The son of Jacob, the son of Isaac, the son of Abraham, the son of Terah, the son of Nahor. (Luke 3:34)

Messiah would be a descendant of Jacob

“I see him, but not now; I behold him, but not near; a star shall come forth from Jacob, a scepter shall rise from Israel, and shall crush through the forehead of Moab, and tear down all the sons of Sheth. (Num. 24:17)

...The son of Jacob, the son of Isaac, the son of Abraham, the son of Terah, the son of Nahor. (Luke 3:34)

Messiah would come from the tribe of Judah

“The scepter shall not depart from Judah,
nor the ruler’s staff from between his feet,
until Shiloh comes, and to him shall be the
obedience of the peoples.” (Gen. 49:10)

...the son of Amminadab, the son of Admin,
the son of Ram, the son of Hezron, the son
of Perez, the son of Judah... (Luke 3:33)

Messiah would be a prophet

The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your countrymen, you shall listen to him. (Deut. 18:15)



Messiah would be a prophet

20. and that He may send Jesus, the Christ appointed for you, 21 whom heaven must receive until the period of restoration of all things about which God spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from ancient time. 22 “Moses said, **‘THE LORD GOD WILL RAISE UP FOR YOU A PROPHET LIKE ME FROM YOUR BRETHREN; TO HIM YOU SHALL GIVE HEED** to everything He says to you. (Acts 3:20–22)

Messiah would be heir to King David's throne

12. “When your days are complete and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your descendant after you, who will come forth from you, and I will establish his kingdom. 13. “He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. (2 Sam. 7:12-13)

Messiah would be heir to King David's throne

There will be no end to the increase of His government or of peace, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness from then on and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will accomplish this. (Isa. 9:7)

Messiah would be heir to King David's throne

32. “He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; 33 and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end.”

(Luke 1:32-33)



Messiah's throne will be anointed and eternal

“In the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom which will never be destroyed, and that kingdom will not be left for another people; it will crush and put an end to all these kingdoms, but it will itself endure forever. (Dan. 2:44)



Messiah's throne will be anointed and eternal

8. But of the Son He says, “YOUR THRONE, O GOD, IS FOREVER AND EVER, AND THE RIGHTEOUS SCEPTER IS THE SCEPTER OF HIS KINGDOM.. 10 And, “YOU, LORD, IN THE BEGINNING LAID THE FOUNDATION OF THE EARTH, AND THE HEAVENS ARE THE WORKS OF YOUR HANDS;... 12 AND LIKE A MANTLE YOU WILL ROLL THEM UP; LIKE A GARMENT THEY WILL ALSO BE CHANGED. BUT YOU ARE THE SAME, AND YOUR YEARS WILL NOT COME TO AN END.” (Heb. 1:8, 10, 12)

Messiah would be a priest after the order of Melchizedek

The LORD has sworn and will not change His mind, “You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.” (Ps. 110:4)



Messiah would be a priest after the order of Melchizedek

5. So also Christ did not glorify Himself so as to become a high priest, but He who said to Him, “YOU ARE MY SON, TODAY I HAVE BEGOTTEN YOU”; 6. just as He says also in another passage, “YOU ARE A PRIEST FOREVER ACCORDING TO THE ORDER OF MELCHIZEDEK.” (Heb. 5:5-6)

Messiah would be praised by little children

From the mouth of infants and nursing babes
You have established strength because of Your
adversaries, to make the enemy and the
vengeful cease. (Ps. 8:2)



Messiah would be praised by little children

15. But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the wonderful things that He had done, and the children who were shouting in the temple, “Hosanna to the Son of David,” they became indignant 16. and said to Him, “Do You hear what these children are saying?” And Jesus *said to them, “Yes; have you never read, ‘OUT OF THE MOUTH OF INFANTS AND NURSING BABIES YOU HAVE PREPARED PRAISE FOR YOURSELF’?” (Matt. 21:15-16)
